**definition** (dEHfuhnihshuhn) *noun* The meaning of a word.

**example** (ihgzampuhl) *noun* Something to be imitated, a model.

### **figurative language**

Writing that you are not suppose to believe exactly as it is written; should not be taken literally.

Example: He was so confused it was like his world was turned upside down.

**inference** (ihnfuruhns) *noun* An educated guess about something that is not directly stated in a passage, but is strongly hinted.

**literary device** The use of a writing technique to create a special effect or feeling.

**personification** (pursonuhfuhkayshuhn) *noun* A literary device in which human qualities are given to a nonliving thing.

### **point of view**

1. How a person sees or understands something.
2. The vantage point from which a story is told.

**summarize** (suhmuriiz) *verb* Give the main points or ideas in a passage.
