Suffix -A word or part of a word that is placed at the **end** of a word to change its meaning.

<u>Suffix</u>	<u>Meaning</u>	<u>Example</u>
-able	capable of	<i>fixable</i> (capable of being fixed)
-ation	the process of	<i>creation</i> (the process of creating)
-est	most	<i>largest</i> (most large)
-ful	full of	<i>beautiful</i> (full of beauty)
-ish	like	<i>childish</i> (like a child)
-less	without	<i>hopeless</i> (without hope)
-logy	the study of	<i>mineralogy</i> (the study of minerals)
-ly	in a way or manner	<i>happily</i> (in a happy manner)
-ous	having qualities of	<i>joyous</i> (having the qualities of joy)

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
