<p>FIRST PERSON “First-person narration is told from the point of view of a specific person in the story. It usually includes words such as I, we, and my to show that a person from the story is personally experiencing the action.” - StudyIsland.com</p>	<p>THIRD PERSON “Third-person limited narration is told from the point of view of someone outside of the story. Sometimes the someone is the author of the story. The action is told from a point of view using he, she, they, or it. This narration is <i>limited</i> because the narrator only knows as much as the main character.” - StudyIsland.com</p>
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
